brood: to ponder morbidly or persistently [Collins Dictionary]



There is nothing very novel this time, just a familiar old helpmate mixture, with anticipatory effects, tempo play, there-and-back manoeuvres, and the odd function exchange or bit of dual avoidance. The longer problems will make little sense unless they are solved. Grasshoppers, neutrals and Circe are surely too well known to need definition, but the kangaroos (K^g) may be less familiar. Whether moving or capturing, they hop on queen-lines to the next square beyond any two pieces of either colour. Thus in 11, perhaps my favourite among these problems, $K^g a7-f2$ or $K^g d3-f3$ would be possible moves if it were White's turn to play.


