

BROODINGS...

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Rather to my surprise (and no doubt yours) here is an unprecedented eighth issue for this year. Ideas, like cats, come (and go) as they please.

Some notes on the problems: In **3** it is easy to obtain a 6-solution setting by replacing the ♖e4 by a ♘ on f4, but I dislike the resulting repeated ♔-move. In **5** what must be avoided can hardly be missed. The idea of **6** will be used for a thematic tourney to be announced in the next issue of *ORBIT*. The fers (**10**) is new to *Broodings*. It moves just one single square diagonally. Boring, eh? – but it can do things which bishops cannot! The neutrals and chameleons in the last two problems have been seen here before, but not together. Neutral pawns, if they promote, must become neutral pieces, but the question here is whether they should become neutral chameleons. In these problems, as in **5**, some might speak of “tries”; at least what fails may illuminate what works. These two settings complement each other in an obvious way. Best wishes to all.
