Professor Dragutin Bišćan died in Varazdin, Croatia, December 14th 2004. I don't know was he a member of your societies or magazines, but I saw his original compositions published in your magazines. Chessproblem friends knew him as Drago. He was born in Murško Sredisce, August 24th 1923. Professor Drago was a croatian master of problem-chess (which means a master of composition and master of solving) since 1971. He published more than 500 problems and about quarter of that number were awarded compositions. He was editor of chessproblem columns in "Medjimurske novine" (a column "Škola problemskog šaha" = "Problem-chess School") and "Varaždinske vijesti" (a column "Poema šahovskih problema" = "Poem of Chessproblems"). He was a poet, awarded from president of Republic Croatia. Also he get a City Award of Varazdin because of results in pedagogy, publishing and Problemchess. Chessproblemists from Croatia lost a good friend and teacher. Now we are preparing a "Drago Biscan Memorial Tourney" and announcement of this tourney will be sended to you.

Composers are invited to submit their highest-quality compositions for selection for this Album. Entry is open to compositions published during the years 2001-2003. Those who published large numbers of compositions during this period are strongly urged to make a selection consisting of only their very best work. Note that in the case of formal tournaments the date of publication, not the closing date for entries, is decisive. However, compositions published in the award of the 7th WCCT (closing date 1 March 2003) are eligible for this Album. Problems from the 6th WCCT were considered for the 1998-2000 Album and are therefore not eligible.

5 copies of each entry are required. They must be clearly stamped or printed on diagrams on paper of A5 size and normal thickness, one entry per sheet, with the composer's full name and address, the place and year of original publication, the award (if any), and the full solution on the same side as the diagram. If necessary, the solution may be continued on a second sheet – not on the back of the diagram – with the composer's name and the position of the Ks repeated. Entries not complying with these requirements may be rejected.

Entries should be sent by post (NB not by email) to the Section Directors as listed below, postmarked not later than **31.08.2005**.

The PCCC makes the following recommendations:

Anyone entering compositions by another composer should, where possible, obtain the agreement of that composer beforehand.

Cyrillic names and addresses of composers should be written in Cyrillic capital letters and preferably also transcribed into Latin letters.

The source of each composition should, if possible, include not only the magazine and year of publication but also the month or magazine number and/or the number of the composition.

Computer-tested compositions should be indicated by the symbol C+.

Unusual fairy forms should be defined.
