
Theme:

An orthodox H#2 is required in which each phase must have a black tempo.

I received 29 anonymous problems (of which 1 was not thematic) from the director **Paz Einat**. The level was satisfactory. I had to remove one problem (Kd4/Kg5) due to anticipation (Yosi Retter, Variantim 2011, see at the end). After the congress a full anticipation was found for the 1st Prize problem (Bakcsi & Paros 2nd Prize probleemblad 1962, see at the end) and the problem had to be removed from the award.





The BQ tempo moves are captures of white pieces and two further white pieces are captured by the BK. Rich and colorful.




The first move by the BQ enables the pinning white piece to unpin the tempo playing black piece. A smart problem.
