57 h#2s on anonymous diagrams I was received by the Director of the tourney. The general level of the compositions is a good. I excluded from the award the following problems because of cooks: no.J2 and anticipations: no.J50 anticipated by Alexander Pankratiev & Michail Gershinsky 2. Com. Z. Birnov MT 2013 (Appendix I), and no.J51 anticipated by Abdelazis Onkoud 3.HM Sredba na Solidarnosta 2012 (Appendix II). My main criteria in judging were originality, complexity, economy, and the overall artistic effect. From the rest problems I proposal following ranking.

1st Prize – F.Abdurahmanovic-no.J14: TF-helpmate with two pairs of thematically connected solutions and using of white half-pin mechanism. Alternate moving of the white half-pined pieces (L/D) along the pin-line is shown in the 1st pair, while the 2nd pair presents indirect unpin of the white half-pinned piece with Umnov effects A masterpiece.




2nd Prize – no.J34: Organized disharmony with triple setting of Abdurhmanovic IV theme (Reciprocal white/black transferred pin), pin-model mates, white reciprocal moves in II & III solutions and Black play on the same square (c2) in the 2nd move. I. 1.Dd3 Lf5 2.Kc2 Se3# ; II. 1.De2 Lf3:(A) 2.Tc2 Th1#(B); III. 1.Te1 Th1(B) 2.Dc2 Lf3#(A).

3rd Prize – no.J11: Presentation of difficult task of changed function of 4 white moves in 3 pairs of thematically connected solutions and 6 model mates. I. 1.Da7: Sd7+ (A) 2.Kd4 c3# (C); II. 1.Lf2: Sg6+ (B) 2.Ke4 d3# (D); III. 1.Ld2: (Sg6+?) c3 (d3?) (C) 2.Lf4 Ld4#; IV. 1.f4 d3 (c3?) (D) 2.Sf5 Sg4#; V. 1.Te6 Le3 2.Sd6 Sd7# (A); VI. 1.Le6 (Le4?) Kg7: 2.Sd5 Sg6# (B); Try: (1.Le4? Kg7: 2.Sd5 Sd3+ 3.Ld3:).

4th Prize – no.J15: An original setting of bi-colour Bi-Valve by BPg7 one-two play with white line-opening and alternative masked interference of the white line, consecutive white gate-opening, white half-pin, black direct pin and pin-mates in a well constructed position without white pawns.. I. 1.g5 Lf8 (Db7?) 2.Lh3 Db1#; II. 1.g6 Db7 (Lf8?) 2.Lh2 Ld2#.







1st Honourable Mention – no.J52: An attractive presentation of Zilahi paradox theme in TF helpmate form with two pairs of thematically connected solutions and consecutive capture of two white pieces. I. 1.Sg5: Td4+ 2.Kb5: Le8#; II. 1.Sf2 Sc7 2.Sg4: Tg4#; III. 1.Dg6: Sd6+ 2.Kd3: Td5#; IV. 1.De6: Tb3 2.Df7 Lf7:#.

2nd Honourable Mention – no.J18: A diagonal/orthogonal setting of white masked battery creation with black bi-valve and battery mates with mixed critical interference and delayed Umnov effect. I. 1.Sd3 Lg2 2.Th4 f4#; II. 1.Sb4 Ta5 2.Ld7 c6#.


3rd Honourable Mention – no.J41: A diagonal/orthogonal setting of Zilahi theme and Chumakov theme with reciprocal capturing of white and black thematic pieces in an economical Meredith position. I. 1.Td2: Tf2 2.Le5 Td2:#; II. 1.Lf6: Lg5 2.Td3 Lf6:#.

4th Honourable Mention – no.J6: TF helpmate with two pairs of thematically connected solutions and changed function of the white moves Sc3 & Sf2 in an economical Meredith position. I. 1.Dc7 Sc3+ (A) 2.Ke5 Lc7:#; II. 1.Df7 Sf2+ (B) 2.Lf5 Tf7:#; III. 1.Le6 Tc8 2.Kd5: Sc3 (A)#; IV. 1.f3 Lf4 2.Dd5: Sf2 (B)#.

1st Commendation – no.J29: Combination of fourfold Black play to the same square (e5) in B1 move and Albino theme in two pairs of thematically connected solutions. a) I. 1.Ke5 ed3! (ef3?) 2.Sd4 Sf7#; II. 1.e5 ef3! (ed3?) 2.Lf5 Sdf5:#; b) I. 1.Se5 Sf1: (Sef5?) 2.Dd5 e3#; II. 1.Le5 Sef5+ (Sf1:?) 2.Kd5 e4#.


2nd Commendation – no.J56: TF-helpmate with two pairs of thematically connected solutions and using of two white indirect battery mechanisms with same front piece (WSd4). Indirect unpin of the pinned white back line indirect battery pieces is shown in the 1st pair, while the 2nd pair presents black self-block and direct mates by the front indirect battery piece (WS). I. 1.La6 Db6 2.Kd5 Dc6#; II. 1.Le1 Td2 2.Ke3 Te2#; III. 1.g6 Sf3 2.g5 Sg5#; IV. 1.Se5 Se2 2.Sf3 Sg3:#.






